- **Practice** for contestants 9-20 years old, Tuesday, July 23 – 5:00pm at the Cultural Arts Building, Putnam County Fairgrounds, 200 Veterans Drive
- **Interviews** for ages 16-20 Fairest of the Fair Contestants will be Sunday, July 21, 2p, Cultural Arts Building, Putnam County Fair Grounds, 200 Veterans Drive.
- Do not leave after interview as there will be a group picture made.
- **Pageant** – Saturday, July 27 – 6pm – Cookeville Community Center

Contestant must reach her 16th birthday but not her 21st birthday on or before December 31, current year.

- Contestants must be residents of Putnam County and attend school in Putnam County. If contestant is home-schooled parents must live in Putnam County and parents must provide driver's license. If parents are not guardians, guardianship proof is required & guardian's drivers license.
- Contestant cannot qualify if she has ever been married or has had children. (State Rules).
- Contestant who marries before fulfilling her duties will be required to relinquish the crown to the first runner- up.
- No previous Putnam County Fairest of the Fair may compete.
- The Fairest of the Fair, Young Miss and Teen Miss will be expected to participate in the entire fair as requested. Schedules will be provided so queens will know where to be at what times starting opening day.
- Contestants in all divisions will be judged on poise, personality and overall appearance. In the Fairest of the Fair division ONLY they will also be judged on interview and on-stage question.
- All other categories will be judge on poise, personality, overall appearance.
- Any person, business or business person may sponsor contestant.
- Fairest of the Fair contestants must attach a copy of her driver's license to her application.
- Contestant category is determined by age as of pageant date.
- Previous year's winners are not allowed to give up their crown and then compete in the next category.

Fairest of the Fair Contestants - Please attach a typed one sheet bio about yourself. "This will be read on stage." You should submit an 8x10 photo EVEN if you are not entering the Most Photogenic. The judges can view this photo and read your Bio prior to the interview. Put photo in a clear protective cover.

Contestants will be judged on poise, positive energy, confidence, stage presence, and over-all beauty. Contestants must be a resident of Putnam County and if school age, they must attend a Putnam County school or home school in Putnam County.

Optional Categories – Open to All Contestants

- All Contestants may enter any, all or none of the following Optional Categories: Prettiest Eyes, Prettiest Hair, Prettiest Smile, Most Photogenic for an Entry Fee of \$5.00 “Each” in addition to the entry fee listed above.
- Attach a 5 X 7 or 8 X 10 glossy photo of contestant entering Most Photogenic with name and address on the back of the photograph.
- Contestant category will be determined by age as of pageant date.
- Winners in previous year are NOT eligible to give up their crown and then compete in the next category. If you won last year you are not able to compete this year.

OUTDOOR MEAT COOKERY CONTEST

Thursday, August 8 – 5p – Music Barn

Age Classification (Based on completed grade during current school year)

Class 1 – Jr. High (6th – 8th Grades) Class 2 – Sr. High. (9th – 12th Grades)

Rules:

1. Individual may enter only one division based on their grade completed the previous year.
2. Divisions are: beef, lamb, pork and poultry.
3. Contestants will be scored according to the 4-H Outdoor Meat Cookery score sheet.
4. Contestants should bring two fresh, uncooked meat items for preparation. The retail cut is their choice; however, the cut must be prepared within the time limit. The poultry item may be either chicken or turkey. The cut can be marinated prior the contest. Contestants should be prepared to state a degree of doneness (rare, medium rare, medium, medium well, or well done) for beef, lamb & pork.
5. Preparation & cooking time is 2 hours. Contestants are required to turn in the prepared meat at the end of the stated cooking time. Contestants will submit only the prepared meat cut to the judges. No additional items should be submitted.
6. Contestants should provide judges copy of any recipes used. Sauces & marinades may be commercial or personal recipe.
7. Charcoal grills, charcoal, starters, grilling supplies & table must be provided by the contestants. Contestants preparation area will be no more than 10' by 10'. Grills with or without hoods may be used. Also, aluminum foil may be used to construct a windscreen or hood. NO GAS GRILLS.
8. Contestants should prepare cooking area & cook their meat without adult supervision.
